A mosque is a Muslim place of worship, learning and celebration.




Qur'an

Imam

The imam is the leader of a mosque and the worship services held within and also of a Muslim community.



Allah

The name used by Muslims for God. It is 'God' in Arabic.

Mecca

Mecca is the home of the Ka'bah, which was originally constructed by the Prophets Is'mail and Ibrahim. It was restored by the Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) after his pilgrimage in AD628.



Hajj

Hajj is the fifth Pillar of Islam. It is a special pilgrimage performed once a year to Mecca to worship and pray to Allah.



Ramadan

Muslims recognise the fourth Pillar of Islam, Sawm, during the ninth month of the Islamic calendar.

Muslims fast during the daylight hours of the month of Ramadan.



Eid al-Fitr

Eid al-Fitr is the end of Ramadan, and it is a great time of celebration for Muslims. It is a way of thanking Allah for helping Muslims stay strong through Ramadan.



Muezzin

A person who, standing from the minaret of a mosque, calls Muslims to prayer.



Adhan

The call a Muezzin makes from a minaret for Muslims to come to prayer.



Minaret

The tower at the top of a mosque where the Muezzin makes their call to prayer.




Prophet

A messenger who speaks the word of Allah.



Five Pillars

Five acts that Muslims do to live a good life. The five pillars are Shahadah, Salat, Zakat, Sawm and Hajj.



Salat

The second pillar of Islam is Salat, which is a prayer ritual. Muslims perform Salat five times a day.
