Prior learning – Early years

Key Learning

Recall religious and world-view stories about how to care for others. Explore stories that might have an effect on the way people care for others.

Know about and understand the meaning behind the Christian parable of the Good Samaritan from the Bible as told by Jesus.

Know about and understand the meaning behind the Muslim story of the Seven New Kittens and the Prophet Muhammad.

Understand how Sikhs show care for others through langar and sewa. Understand how Hindus show care for others through dana and sewa.

Know about the story of the Buddha and the Buddhist way of life. Express their ideas and opinions about caring for others and give examples of how to do this.
